WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey is authorized to prescribe reports pertaining to the Local Fiscal Affairs, as per R.S.52: 27BB-34; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations, and,

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and,

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and,

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board, and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

RESOLUTION #116-04-08-09

Resolution of the Jamesburg Borough Council in Opposition to Senate Bill No. S-2577/Assembly Bill No. A-3772 Known as the "Age-Restricted Housing Conversion Bill"

WHEREAS, the New Jersey State Senate and Assembly have approved Senate Bill No. S-2577 known as the "Age-Restricted Housing Conversion Bill"; and

WHEREAS, S-2577 allows a developer, under certain conditions outside the control of the Borough, to convert an approved age restricted development (where no units have been sold) into a market rate housing project without age restrictions without applying for a zoning variance; and

WHEREAS, this bill would impose an additional property tax burden on local residents by increasing the number of school children in the community thereby increasing education costs and facility expenses; and

WHEREAS, this legislation would affect a currently approved project within the Borough of Jamesburg as well as future approved projects; and

WHEREAS, this legislation restricts the ability of Local Governments to make sound local planning decisions and would allow state government and developers to usurp those decisions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Jamesburg, County of Middlesex, New Jersey that the Mayor and Council hereby oppose this Bill and urge Governor Jon S. Corzine to veto this ill-advised legislation for the reasons set forth above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Jamesburg hereby urge the Governor and the Legislature to discontinue the practice of adopting legislation to the benefit of contractors and developer at the detriment of the taxpayers.

Mayor LaMantia explained the legislation and how it would hurt Jamesburg taxpayers by increasing the number of schoolchildren. Councilman Kostbar commented that market housing is more expensive to the town than age restricted housing. Councilman Grimes stated that municipalities are making the effort to keep taxes down, but this type of legislation will hurt. The legislature is not listening to the needs of the people and municipal government. Councilman Longo commented on the impact on many municipalities due to the growth of the student population and that municipal government will no longer have control over long term planning.
